Dear St. Peter's Family,

I write this letter to you from Athens, Greece, a well-populated city of five million people. It was here in Athens, two thousand years ago, when the apostle Paul preached the Gospel to the Athenians for the first time. You can read Paul's sermon in the Acts of Apostles (Acts 17:16-34), and last week, I delivered the same sermon on Mars Hill, the exact place from where Paul preached his well-known sermon (see photo below).

Some would say Paul was not so "successful" in Athens. In the Biblical record, Paul did not bring as many to the Christian faith in Athens as he did in other places. He probably did not have that many converts to the faith after his first sermon in Athens. That said, I write to you from Athens, the capitol of a country that is now ninety-seven percent Greek Orthodox. I would argue that Paul *was* successful, and more importantly, the apostle Paul was *faithful* to his ministry of the Gospel.

We pilgrims have traveled from Athens to Corinth to Berea to Thessalonica to Philippi back to Athens to Ephesus to Rhodes to Crete and finally, back to Athens. It has been a fast-paced walk to follow in the footsteps of St. Paul, but with each step of the way, we have come to know the remarkable and lasting impact the apostle Paul made in these places and beyond. The apostle Paul first preached the Gospel in this Mediterranean world, and he was successful! Paul ventured to Philippi where he baptized Lydia, the first Christian baptized on European soil. Lydia's baptism was only the first of many more baptisms to come in the West, including our own.

Paul planted the seeds of Christianity in this country of Greece, and his first efforts now permeate the entire Greek culture. One night, in the little island town of Mykonos, I wandered into a Greek Orthodox church after dinner. I had been in the church for only a couple of minutes before a young couple came into the church. The young couple (probably millennials by my estimation) looked like they had been on a dinner date. But, after a night out for dinner, this hip, young Greek couple ever-so naturally stepped into the church to adore an icon, light a candle, and say their prayers. The young couple walked into a church, experienced church, and walked out of the church like it was no different from brushing their teeth in the morning.

The apostle Paul was successful, and more importantly, he was faithful to plant the seeds of the Gospel in certain places that would bear the fruit we know today. Imagine what seeds we might be planting in our daily lives and ministry. In our own baptismal covenant, we say that we will proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ. There is no doubt Paul was successful, and there is no doubt we will be successful in following in the footsteps of St. Paul. We too can and will be faithful to our ministry of the Gospel. May we continue to walk in love as Christ loved us.

May Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on Monday, May 20, 2019 at 5:30pm. Fr. Bert opened the meeting with a prayer. His prayer was followed up by a few Vestry members sharing life and ministry moments.

The Vestry approved the minutes from the April vestry meeting. The Vestry approved the minutes for the action taken over email to approve the replacement of the wooden panels in the Narthex with beveled glass. The Vestry approved the minutes for the action taken over email to recommend Sam Hunnicutt for candidacy for holy orders in the Episcopal Church.

The April financials had been emailed to the Vestry by the Controller, Kristie Keese. The financials had also been reviewed by the Finance Commission. The reports showed that our overall income is at 42% and expenses are at 38%. The financial report was approved by the Vestry.

On behalf of St. Peter's Episcopal School, Dee Elliott reported that enrollment is full for the 2019-2020 school year. The school board has a plan to purchase a new school bus, and the school board hopes to have the new bus by the time school begins in August. The new school board members are Amy Rector and Kevin Devore. At the May meeting, the school board elected new officers for the 2019-2020 school year. Lynda DeMasco will serve as President; Elizabeth Schneider will serve as Vice President; and Scott Herman will serve as Treasurer.

Jim Hayes reported on behalf of the Endowment Board. He reported that the board has decided to meet on a quarterly basis, rather than on a monthly basis. The Board recommended to the Vestry that the Board of Directors be expanded to seven persons. The Vestry took action to expand the Endowment Board of Directors to seven. The Board recommended that Herb Williamson be appointed by the Vestry to serve a three-year term on the Board of Directors. The Vestry took action to appoint Herb Williamson to a three-year term on the Endowment Board of Directors.

Kathy Voss reported on behalf of the ECW. Kathy reported that the ECW approved funding for the purchase of new vestments for the church and a designated amount of funding to Love for the Least.

Stephen Drane, Junior Warden, reported to the Vestry. Stephen reported that Janet Boutin and Guy Scott have worked on cleaning up the grounds and the tree trimming at the school Stephen also reported that the glass for the panels in the narthex has been purchased and delivered to the church. The glass panels will be installed soon.

Lou Ann Maxwell, Senior Warden, had written a report that was delivered to the Vestry. In her report, Lou Ann recommended that St. Peter's work with trustees from the Cailloux Theater in having a third party collect payments for the various beneficiaries of the Moore Bequest. The Vestry took action to proceed with the recommendation.

Fr. Bert reported to the Vestry. Fr. Bert reported on a successful Holy Week, Easter, parish picnic, and pilgrimage to Greece. Fr. Bert shared a bit about his experience on the pilgrimage to Greece and Turkey and the transformation that took place for the group of thirty-four on the trip. He looks forward to sharing more with the parish in his sermons, teaching, and communications. Fr. Bert also reported that he and the search team for the Children's and Youth Minister plan to soon have in-person interviews with candidates.

Fr. Bert also reported to the Vestry that St. Peter's received a gift of \$15,000 from the Magdalene House. The Magdalene House recently dissolved to become part of Mercy Gate Ministries. As a result, the Board of Directors decided to give \$15,000 to St. Peter's. In a letter to the St. Peter's Family, the Magdalene House Executive Director Kathy Bogie wrote, "We are deeply grateful to you and the Episcopal Church Women for your generosity. You have given prayers, volunteerism, facility space and financial gifts which were key in making Magdalene House a reality. Your faithfulness in outreach to make Christ known to others made an impact. We hope that our gift will assist in making Christ known in our community."

Sam Hunnicutt met with the Vestry to discuss his process toward ordination. Sam was admitted to postulancy on July 27, 2018, and he hopes to soon go before the Standing Committee of the Diocese of West Texas for his Candidacy interviews. Sam reported on his ministries at St. Peter's, including his leadership in Children's Chapel and his study of *The Story* on Wednesday evenings. As directed by the bishop, Sam meets frequently with Fr. Bert as part of his formation for Holy Orders. Fr. Bert has recommended a number of books and resources to Sam. These books and resources have provided a wealth of content for Sam's and Fr. Bert's discussions and work together. The two of them have discussed a variety of topics: sacramental theology, church history, Anglican identity, administrative practices, and manual acts for the diaconate and priesthood. The Vestry affirmed its decision to recommend Sam Hunnicutt to the Standing Committee and provided prayerful and sober judgment that Sam Hunnicutt possesses such qualifications as would be fitting for admission as a Candidate for Holy Orders in the Church of God.

With no other business, the Vestry and Rector closed their meeting with the Lord's Prayer and the meeting was adjourned.

The next meeting will be Monday, June 17, at 5:30pm in the Multipurpose Room of Tucker Hall. As always, anyone in the parish is welcome to attend. If you wish to be on the agenda and speak, however, please notify the Rector no later than the previous Tuesday, June 11, when he writes the agenda and then sends the agenda to the Vestry.
