Jerusalem

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' (Matthew 21:10)

Ancient maps often put Jerusalem at the center of the world. All roads lead to Rome you say? Well, not always.

As is well known, Jerusalem is a holy city for the three Abrahamic faiths. For Christians, Jerusalem's Church of the Holy Sepulchre is the traditional site of the crucifixion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. For Jews, the holiest place in Judaism is in Jerusalem – the Western Wall, a foundation wall of Herod's Temple that was known to Jesus and destroyed by the Romans in AD 61. For Muslims, the Dome of the Rock in Jerusalem is the third holiest place in Islam; it is where Muhammed is said to have ascended into heaven.

Jerusalem draws Christians together on Good Friday in the mystery of how it is that God "gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). This holy city also draws us into the sacred mystery of the first Eucharist; the healing pools of Bethsaida; Jesus' overturning of the money changers' tables at the Temple; Mary's devotion at the foot of the cross; and the empty tomb and the good news, which was slowly realized on the way to Emmaus.

As Jerusalem draws Christians together from around the world, the Good Friday Offering is an opportunity to bring The Episcopal Church together with a singular focus.

Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, 'Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?' (Luke 24:18)
