His objective: (from his resume) "Seeking an opportunity to empower the people of God and foster my call to faithfully proclaim the Gospel, share in the holy sacraments, and nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace.

Father Bert is committed to teaching the Gospel, and through Christian formation, making it relevant for today. He led St. Mark's through a significant growth of membership, stewardship, and programs, with a successful capital campaign, a building project, and the founding of St. Mark's Episcopal School. He developed strong lay leadership and empowered the laity for the ministry of the church. One of Father Bert's gifts is to envision, initiate, and cultivate the ministries required for a vibrant church community.

Father Bert is married to Sarah who attended Camp Mystic for several years and has maintained ties to the Hill Country. They have two children, Eloise (7) and Oliver (4). Oliver will be attending St. Peter's School this year and Eloise will attend Tally Elementary.

In my phone conversations with Bert, he has conveyed his and his family's excitement about the move to St. Peter's, and Kerrville. Through many prayers, he and Sarah feel that they have been led to us. In the same vein, the search committee have all expressed to me that through prayer and discernment, they were led to Bert. I am excited and feel your excitement at the beginning of this new chapter in the life of St. Peter's Episcopal Church.

A TIME OF CHANGE AND ACTIVITY AUGUST 2016-2017

This time last year, Stockton Williams was retiring after 14 years as Rector. You were waiting for an Interim who would begin the middle of August. The Rev. Tom Murray, III was the constant. Kara Joy Baker had been hired as the Choir Director.

You had experienced change; you were anticipating change; and you are still dealing with change. My time as Interim has concluded. Tom Murray, Associate Rector, after twelve years, is becoming Rector of Grace Episcopal Church in Weslaco. You are now waiting for the new Rector, The Rev. Bert Baetz, who begins his work on Sunday, August 27th.

Think about this last year for a moment.

The Search Committee was formed in early September (2016). Construction on the St. Peter's - Diocese of West Texas Habitat House began that September as well; the completion and blessing of the house took placet his past June 10. Magdalene House will soon be ready to receive the first occupants. Incredible progress has been made under the direction of Kathy Bogie and a very dedicated board. St. Peter's school continues to thrive, receiving excellent marks in every category. Both Magdalene House and St. Peter's school had very successful fund raising projects this past spring. A men's lunch group (P.F.F.) began this past September and we now average fourteen to fifteen present every Tuesday. Wednesday evening worship, dinner and programs were very well attended and much anticipated. Many of you attended and were moved by an inspiring Lent program with five different clergy speaking and sharing their faith journeys. Jane Elwood and Debra Parmley, with a great deal of help from Linda Jordan, Fran Cox, and Barbara Cordova began a new Bible Study, which has been very well received and is ongoing. In the midst of all this, thanks be to God, we found an excellent organist, Rev. David Miron!

Much of this would not have happened without the presence and hard work of Barbara Cordova, who is in her second year as Senior Warden. The congregation of St. Peter's has been, and is, in excellent and capable hands with her leadership. She has given many hours of service and has been of incredible help to me as your Interim priest.



Finally Beloved,



Our experience of the Divine is in the present moment; we can, like Moses on Mount Horeb, see where God has been (God's backside literally, Exodus 33:23); most of us can look back at our lives and see where God has been at work. But the actual experience of God's presence, an encounter with the Divine, is only in the present moment. Worship is designed, mostly through long experience over centuries, to be a way to access that experience. The Arts, which are human endeavors that place us firmly in the present moment as we encounter them, are essential to that.

Music is especially so, being a temoral art that keeps us fixed in the present moment through the flow of the music in our senses. Next time you are listening or singing in church, practice being fully embodied as you do so: feel your feet on the floor, the hymnal or program min your hands, the cool air entering your nostrils and lungs as you breathe. Let God's presence become part of your awareness as you sing. But this comes with a warning: God's presence changes us. Don't say I didn't tell you...
