

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him. "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." (Luke 11:1)

Dear St. Peter's Family,



The seven practices for the Way of Love provide an everyday rule of life, and the third practice, prayer, is our everyday response to God. In leading a Jesuscentered life, we can turn to God, we can then learn more about the God to whom we turn, and we can then pray to the God revealed to us in Scripture. These are the first three practices to the Way of Love.

The BCP Catechism defines prayer as "responding to God, by thought and by deeds, with or without words." Yes, prayer takes on many different forms, both in word and action, but prayer can mostly be described as our response to God. We might respond to God's grace with a prayer of thanksgiving. We might respond to God's mercy by praying for the needs of others. We might respond to God by praying to the God revealed to us in Scripture.

I recall another friend's response to a certain teaching from Jesus. My friend went to church one Sunday, not necessarily knowing what she might hear in the Gospel appointed for that day. She heard the appointed passage from Matthew's gospel, when Jesus instructs his disciples to forgive not seven times, but seventy-seven times (a whole lot).

The woman left church that Sunday with a different perspective on forgiveness. She incorporated that lesson and revelation from Jesus into her prayer life. She prayed for the power to forgive, and she was then able to forgive somebody who had wronged her years ago. Prayer is responding to God, by thought and by deeds.

The regular Episcopal invocation to prayer suggests a quality to the Christian life. The Lord be with you. And also with you. Let us pray. In other words, let us lead a life in response to the God we know in Christ. St. Paul tells us to pray without ceasing, and no doubt we are called to be a people of prayer, always responding to God's love for us and the whole world. There is not one correct form of prayer, and yet when we pray, we all find ourselves on the same path, walking in the way of love.










I'm Gonna Let It Shine

Organ Update July 23, 2019

To date, I've got all the pipes removed, wrapped, labeled, and put in the trays Stephen Drane kindly made for this. Most of the pipes were not stamped with their pitch as is customary, so I had to label all of them to keep track of them and be certain to get them back in the right places!







As you'll see the next time you're in the church, I'm now dismantling the structure and readying the organ chamber to be painted. Painting the bare concrete and the sheetrock walls with gloss enamel will help reflect more sound out into the church and allow me to make the voicing more gentle when the pipes are being adjusted at the end of this process.

The pipes in this organ come from a variety of sources. One discovery I made when I was able to examine them in detail is that one of the flute stops is from the Casavant Organ company, probably made in the 1920s!

The next steps will involve a call for volunteers, so stay tuned!
