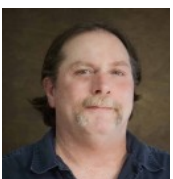

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Dear St. Peter's Family,

I recently performed an office blessing for one of our parishioners, and toward the beginning of the service, I stood at the entrance to her office and cited Scripture to begin the liturgy: Behold, I stand at the door and knock, says the Lord (Rev. 3:20). This outward and visible sign at the entrance to an office in Kerrville, Texas certainly points us to an inward and spiritual truth in our lives. With the Advent season nearly upon us, it is the rich season of the year to listen and attend to that knock on the door.

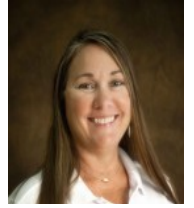
Advent is the season that invites us to remember the ways in which God has come to us, and it is the season that prepares us for his coming again. Behold, I stand at the door and knock, says the Lord. So, will we answer the door? And what can be expected when we do? This is the time of year in which we actually direct our spiritual attention to the advents (comings) of Christ. The liturgical scholar Pius Parsch describes the threefold coming of Christ in this way: Christ *came* in history, Christ *comes* in mystery, and Christ *will come again* in majesty. In Advent, we expand our spiritual horizons to see all the ways in which Christ *advents* (comes) to us.

The season of Advent ends with those stories that prepare us for the celebration of Christ coming in salvation history, namely in the nativity of our Lord. Interestingly, toward the beginning of the Advent season, we actually ponder the ways in which he will come again. What can we expect when Christ will come again? Will we answer the door? And who might we expect to enter when and if we do?

It was not long ago when I watched a video of a young girl who received a surprise visit from her father who had been serving in the military. The young girl was sitting at her desk in her classroom, and when her father entered the classroom, you can imagine what came over the young girl. She was surprised by joy; she was overcome with excitement to see her father come into the room, and they embraced one another. Perhaps we will have a similar response when we open the door for the Lord who knocks. I am reminded of our own Burial Rite which always begins with those assuring anthems, "As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and that at the last he will stand upon the earth. After my awaking, he will raise me up; and in my body I shall see God. I myself shall see, and my eyes behold him who is my friend and not a stranger" (BCP 491).

I encourage you to not only welcome this season of Advent, but let us also welcome Christ. Let us welcome the one who came to visit us in great humility and shall come again in glorious majesty. Let us open the door to the one who knocks.

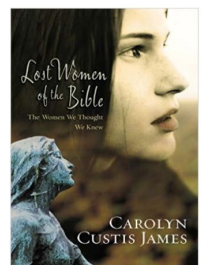

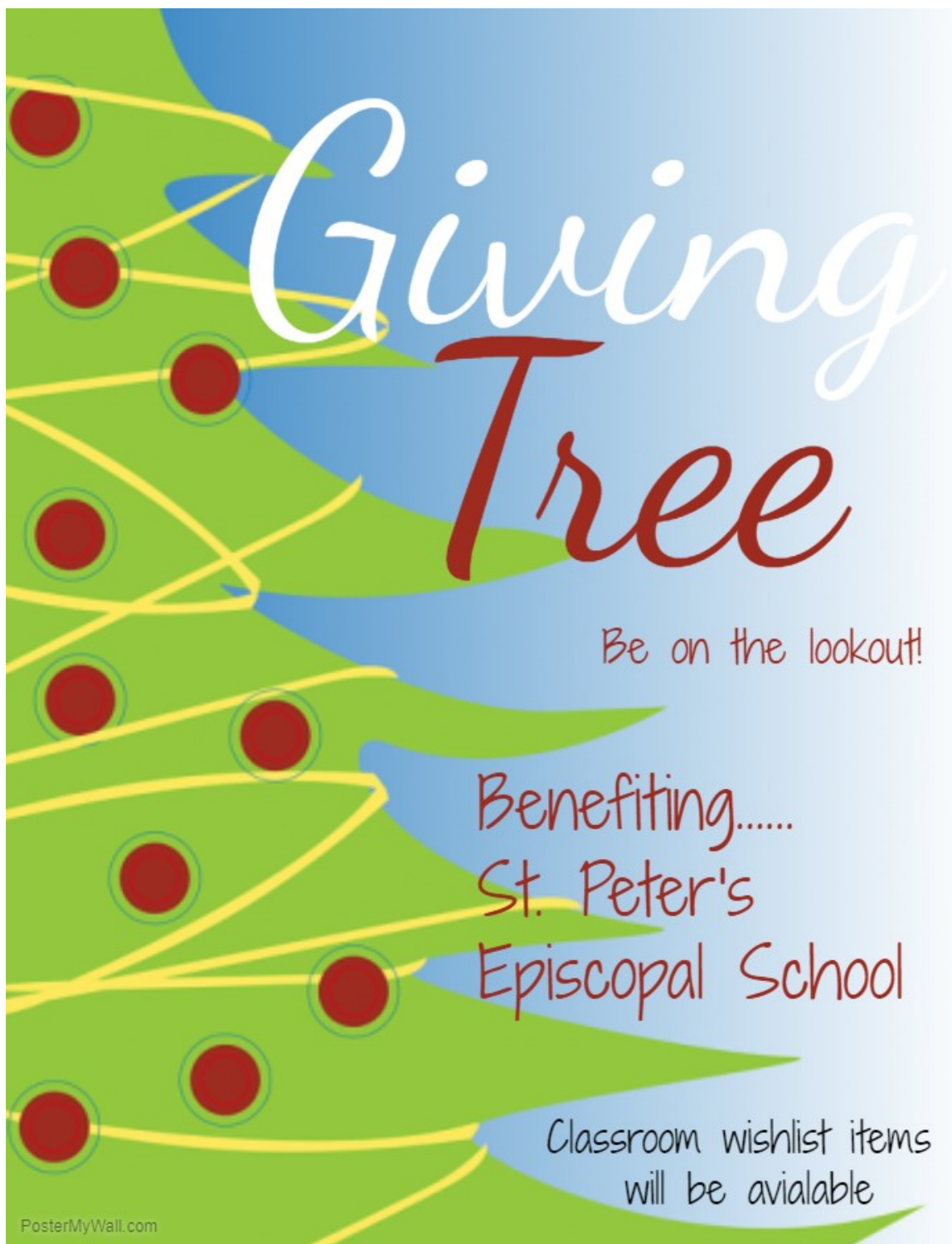

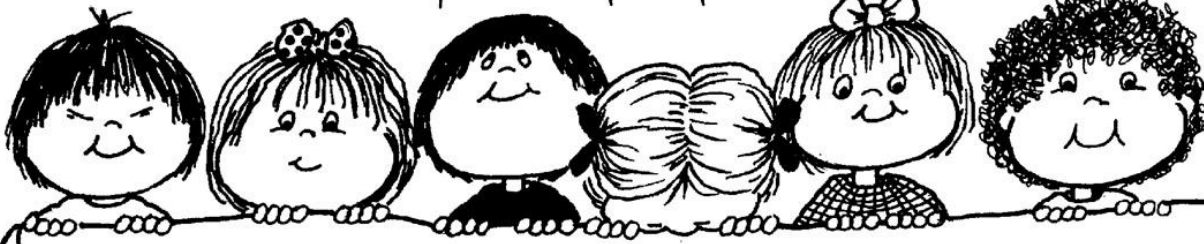


NOISY OFFERING– ALL THREE CHURCH SERVICES

November Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on Monday, November 20 at 5:30pm. Fr. Bert opened the meeting in prayer, and at the beginning of the meeting, the Vestry approved the minutes from the October 16 meeting.

Fr. Bert welcomed Eric Maloney from the Kerrville Fire & EMS Department and Juan Trevizo from the Kerrville Police Department. The rector and vestry had a discussion with the first responders about the general safety of our campus. Officer Trevizo addressed certain measures to consider with the facilities including the exterior lights of our campus. In response to the shootings in Sutherland Springs, the discussion was had about how to keep our campus safe. Subsequent to the meeting, the vestry formally appointed a Safe Campus Committee with the following members: Catherine Kern (co-chair), Eric Maloney (co-chair), Lee Underwood, the Rev. Bert Baetz, Brooksie Bledsoe, and Stephen Drane. The Safe Campus Committee will report back to the vestry at the December 18 meeting.

Chrisie Jennings, Parish Administrator, presented the financials that she worked on with Catherine Schulte, Treasurer. Previously emailed, October financials showed that our income is down (76%) however so are our expenses (76%). Our loss for the month is \$9,685. Our total loss for the year is 77% (vs. 83% budgeted). So we are fairing better than budgeted. There is not one overall expense category (i.e. Salaries, General & Admin, etc.) that is over budget. The Vestry approved the financials.

Barbara Cordova reported on behalf of the Vestry Nominations Committee. The committee is still compiling the list, and in discussion with the vestry, it was decided that we will close nominations on December 17.

Barbara Cordova reported on behalf of the Personnel & Finance Committee. The committee has had several discussions about an initiative to grow our endowment funds for the purpose of long-term sustainability. Fr. Bert has shared his support of this initiative and intends to incorporate this initiative into the leadership's work in the New Year.

The Personnel & Finance Committee was encouraged by the increased pledges for 2018 while the committee also addressed the concern of a deficit. Rich Schneider issued a challenge to all vestry members to increase their pledge for 2018 in order to set an example and serve as good models for spiritual giving. It was suggested by the committee to present a deficit budget to the parish at the annual meeting and encourage increased giving to support our programs. It would be understood that after 3 to 4 months, the vestry would re-evaluate that budget and determine if the giving has increased sufficiently to continue with those programs offered. The committee would want to see an increase to the point where additional programs could be implemented!

Vestry voted to include income and expense figures once a month in the Sunday bulletins.

Deborah Rommel reported on behalf of St. Peter's School. The School Board has planned a Fundraiser Luncheon for Tuesday, February 13, and on behalf of the board, Deborah asked vestry members to consider serving as table captains.

Brooksie Bledsoe reported on behalf of the Newcomers Committee. The party for newcomers at the home of Ellen and Paul Schoenfeld was a huge success, and we will look forward to planning another newcomer party for the spring.

Lou Ann Maxwell reported on behalf of the ECW. The next ECW general meeting is December 7th at 10:30 am with the Episcopal School children's Christmas concert followed by Christmas treats & fellowship.

There was no report from the Junior Warden.

Barbara Cordova, Senior Warden, reported to the Vestry. Barbara reported that she had been in touch with Junior Warden Lee Underwood and that the air conditioner in Tucker Hall is now working. Barbara reminded the vestry about the Vestry-Choir Christmas party and encouraged everybody to reply to the Underwoods so they will know how much meat to provide. Barbara also reminded the vestry about Diocesan Council in San Marcos, February 22-24. If anybody is interested in serving as delegate, the person should be in touch with Barbara or Fr. Bert. St. Peter's will host a pre-council meeting of the Northern Convocation on Thursday, Feb. 1 with a light supper at 6:00pm followed by a meeting at 6:45pm.

Fr. Bert Baetz had previously emailed the Rector's report. A couple of highlights from his report: 1) In coordination with the Parish Administrator, Fr. Bert decided to rearrange the office space for some of our staff. The smaller office closest to the conference room is now the office for the Assistant Priest. The larger middle office adjacent to the rector's office has now become the office for multiple staff: the Director of Music, Treasurer, and Magdalene House Executive Director. 2) Fr. Bert has scheduled the Vestry Retreat for January 26-27. This year the retreat will begin on Friday evening with a dinner in town, and the rector and vestry will then spend the day Saturday at the Kroc Center.

For the program, the rector and vestry will welcome the Rev. Lisa Mason (Rector of St. David's, San Antonio) and her husband Mr. Kirk Mason (Canon to the Ordinary in DWTX). In 2019, Fr. Bert plans to return to Camp Capers for the vestry retreat.

Under New Business, the vestry reviewed the outreach designation from 2016 to consider how funds would be designated in 2017. The vestry decided to table that decision until the December meeting.

The rector and vestry closed with the Lord's Prayer and the meeting adjourned.

The next meeting will be Monday, December 18 at 5:30pm in the Multi-purpose Room of Tucker Hall. As always, anyone in the parish is welcome to attend. If you wish to be on the agenda and speak, however, please notify the Rector no later than the previous Wednesday, December 13, when he writes the Agenda and then emails the Agenda to the Vestry.

Gosh! Robin and I have been among you as parishioners for three years already, so an introduction seems hardly necessary. In one of the Gospels, Jesus tells his disciples that he would not call them servants (slaves); he would, instead, call them "friends". Friendship is a kind of love, isn't it? The Ancients believed it to be the chiefest form of love. And of course, Jesus took friendship to the very deepest form of commitment – that of a friend who lays down his/her life for another. That's what he did for us.

So, we shall be friends – friends of Our Lord and friends with one another, layering that friendship with deep Christian care and love over the time that God gives together.

Robin and I have always been and remain happy to be invited to this great parish. And I am delighted to be connected with you in this new and fresh opportunity.

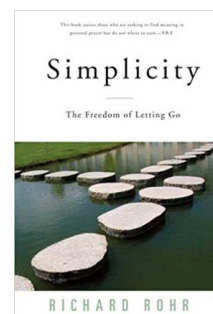

If a certain set of people scare you, then you have to enter into solidarity with them. We have to view reality from their standpoint. That's why Jesus says we have to love our enemies. It's the only way to grasp the whole picture. It's the only way to learn to love the other side of our soul."
