

Over Spring Break, we will have twelve youth on our St. Peter's Washington DC trip, and yes, for the entire group, this will be the trip of a lifetime. Most of our youth on the trip will see our nation's capitol for their first time, and this experience will open our hearts and minds to what it means to be a faithful American and a faithful Christian.

Joining the youth on this pilgrimage to our nation's capitol, we will have five adult chaperones on the trip. I look forward to serving as a chaperone, and it is clear that Julianne Hunnicutt, Sam Hunnicutt, Nicia Oakes, and John Elliott are equally excited to lead our youth group on this once in a lifetime trip.

Our group plans to worship at the National Cathedral. We hope to visit more than one museum, including the Holocaust Museum. One evening, we will take a lighted tour of national monuments. We will pay our respects at Arlington National Cemetery, witnessing the changing of the guards. We might even receive a tour of the White House or the Capitol. Also, as one of our youth put it, the most important thing we will do is give something back to those in need.

Our group will spend half a day volunteering at DC Central Kitchen which is a nationally recognized "community kitchen." The Kitchen recycles food from around Washington DC and uses it as a tool to train unemployed adults to develop work skills while providing thousands of meals for local service agencies in the process.

Pastor Sam and I will lead the morning and evening devotionals on the trip, and we intend to lead our youth into a deeper reflection on what it means to be a faithful citizen of our country and a faithful citizen in Christ's kingdom. Yes, the youth are the future of our church, but they are also the present. Join us in prayer and spirit as we represent St. Peter's in our nation's capitol. I commend this prayer to you in the time leading up to our trip and while we are in Washington DC. Thank you for your support and prayers.

A note from your new Senior Warden:

It is with thanksgiving that the Vestry recently voted unanimously on the opportunity to purchase the Jefferson Apartment complex located contiguous to St. Peter's property at the northwest corner. The purchase initially has been made possible by generous gifts to St. Peter's in the form of contributions to the St. Peter's Endowment Fund, specifically for the purpose of this purchase.

While the Vestry intends to keep the arrangements with the current tenants, the Vestry also wanted to secure ownership of the property which will provide for the future growth of ministries in and through our St. Peter's Parish. To move forward, the Vestry voted to appoint an executive committee of six people that will oversee the purchase and to propose ideas for the foreseeable future of management of the property. Currently, the complex is income producing and will cover maintenance and other expenses. We feel very blessed at St. Peter's to grow our campus to meet our future needs.

January Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on Tuesday, January 22, 2019 at 5:30pm. Fr. Bert opened the meeting with a reading from Scripture and a prayer. Then, the Vestry approved the minutes from the December meeting.

The December financials had been emailed to the Vestry by the Controller, Kristie Keese. The financials had also been reviewed by the Finance Commission. The reports showed that our overall income is 97% and expenses are 96%. The Vestry approved the Financial Report as presented.

David Martin reported on behalf of the Christian Formation Commission. David spoke to the success of the Fellowship Committee with several key events taking place in the parish at the end of the year 2018. He recognized several members of the parish who have been instrumental in planning events. He noted that parents had expressed interest in classes and lessons for children of all ages in the church. Lay volunteers, Pastor Sam, and Fr. Bert have been teaching classes for all ages of children and youth on Sunday mornings. The fellowship events in December showed an increase in participation, and we are seeing more families at church with greater turnout at the St. Peter's events. Fr. Bert had shared with the vestry the job description for a children's and youth minister. David revisited the discussion of that particular job, and Fr. Bert and members of the vestry discussed how the children's and youth minister would help in planning and organizing future events for parishioners.

Jim Hayes reported on behalf of the Endowment Board. Members of the Endowment Board have been involved with the production of video about our Rock of St. Peter's Endowment Fund. The purpose of the video will be both educational and inspirational in terms of growing our endowment for long-term sustainability in the parish. The Endowment Board hopes to show the video on the day of the bishop's visit, Sunday, March 3.

On behalf of the Junior Warden, Stephen Drane reported to the Vestry. Included under the property report, the Vestry considered the addition of a butterfly garden that would be used by both the school and parish. The rector had invited the school director, Janet Boutin, to the Vestry meeting to speak to the proposal of the butterfly garden. The proposed garden would be placed in the yard in between the basketball pavilion and the youth room. The Vestry expressed its support the butterfly garden, and the Vestry will be given more information when it becomes available. Stephen reported that the heating exchange repair has been successfully completed. Stephen also addressed certain repairs that need to be done to the organ and the organ pit. The Vestry proceeded with actions to address those issues.

Rich Schneider, Senior Warden, reported to the Vestry and thanked his fellow vestry members for their support in his year of serving as Senior Warden.

Fr. Bert reported to the Vestry. Fr. Bert welcomed Eric Maloney to the Vestry, and he discussed to the process for electing four new vestry members at the Annual Meeting. With four nominees to fill the four seats, it is more than likely that Fr. Bert will call for those four nominees to be elected by acclamation. Fr. Bert will announce his appointment of the new Senior Warden at the Annual Meeting, and following the Annual Meeting, the Vestry will elect a new Junior Warden. Fr. Bert will soon seek Vestry approval of those delegates and alternates to represent St. Peter's at the 115th Council in the Diocese of West Texas. Fr. Bert reminded the Vestry of the Vestry Retreat to be held at Camp Capers, Feb. 8 and 9, with the Rev. Dr. Kitty Lehman leading the retreat.

Under New Business, Dave Weekley, Chair of the Finance Commission, presented the options on financing the purchase of the Jefferson Manor Apartment project. Several generous gifts had been made to the Endowment Fund, and those gifts were earmarked for the purchase of the apartment. Those gifts have allowed the parish to make a significant down payment toward the purchase of the apartments. In addition to those gifts for the down payment, the parish was offered a very generous financing plan from longstanding friends of St. Peter's. The Vestry approved the financing plan as presented and recommended by the Finance Commission.

Under Old Business, the Vestry revisited the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2019. The budget had been revised and designated reserve transfers were added to the budget. The vestry approved the budget as presented.

The Rector and Vestry closed with the Lord's Prayer and the meeting adjourned.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, February 19, at 5:30pm in the Multipurpose Room of Tucker Hall. As always, anyone in the parish is welcome to attend. If you wish to be on the agenda and speak, however, please notify the Rector no later than the previous Tuesday, February 12, when he writes the agenda and then sends the agenda to the Vestry.

a message from Father Mike

Dear St. Peter's Family,

Recently, I traveled to San Diego, CA, to visit my daughter and grandson. We made day trips to La Jolla, driving through beach communities such as Solana, Pacific, Miramar, Del Mar, Ocean, Coronado, Imperial, etc., each different and interesting from the next, some prettier than others. We spent one day in Palm Springs Desert checking out the scene there. An international film festival was ongoing; lots of movie stars, strange and important-looking people...indeed, a scene. I'd once been invited to allow my name to be put into a rector search for a church in this community. I didn't. I thought we'd look up the church and do a drive-by. We never found it, though perhaps we didn't try hard enough. It was OK that we didn't once I found it online.

One thing I always do when I'm out-of-town is try to see old, beautiful churches. Churches ought to provide the space where we're meant to be still and know God, hear and believe God's Word, worship and adore Christ in the Sacraments, sing the Lord's praises, etc. Very (very) few churches are built today with Beauty first in mind, as in 'the beauty of the Lord.' I, for one, find it difficult to worship and easy to become distracted (and bored) in churches with minimal beauty and symbolism.

As it turned out, churches of any sort were hard to find in our much-driving-around on my trip. Expensive prime real estate seems to have been swiped up a long time ago by houses, apartments, high-rises, surf shops, restaurants, tech companies, big box stores and the like. It feels really secular to me, just a visitor.

St. Peter's looks and feels good to me, an armchair architect-designer-esthete. It possesses good 'bones', I like to say. A lot to work with spiritually and physically. I often wander around alone, sit and reflect, pray and ponder, inside our church. Though I can--and do-envision updates and artistic helps, there's a lot here to feed my soul. If I was a stranger visiting Kerrville, I'd definitely stop in. Not only are we prominently and easily located but, most importantly, I could see and know The Greatest Story Ever Told here. We have much for which to thank our forebears and much to expect from a new generation of worshipers!






School Registration 2019-20






