Some years ago I had the opportunity to write meditations on "THE SEVEN LAST WORDS FROM THE CROSS" as experienced, from the perspective of LONGINUS, ROMAN CENTURION,

the Commanding Officer of the execution squad that first Good Friday

Our service will begin at noon on Good Friday and conclude at 3:00 p.m., corresponding with the time our Lord hung on the Cross. There will be *Meditations* on the *Seven Last Words*, followed by prayer, silence, organ, and hymns. Each "segment" throughout the three hours is some twenty five minutes. You are free to come and go during these periods of silence, but, I urge you, if possible, to arrange your schedule allowing you to remain for the entire service.

As it was for Longinus, it just might be a life changing experience for you.

Longinus begins: "My men and I were assigned to the execution detail on that particular Friday. Crucifixion was nothing new, we did it all the time.....but, this one, this prisoner, was different. I could sense it from the very moment we were summoned to take him away to Golgotha and crucify him.....

Longinus concludes: "There are decisions to be made at the Cross that determine character and destiny – there is no evasion possible. Evasion itself is a moral decision, though a negative one.......

"Giving Over"

The festivities of Christmas and Epiphany thrust us into the season of Lent as we celebrate with the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper and conduct our Ash Wednesday services at or around the time of reading this article. All of these festivities may have left us breathless and fatigued as maybe we have been focusing so much on others. Now our focus changes from the outward to the inward. Personal physical and emotional stumbling blocks to a growing relationship with God. Self-examination can be a rather uncomfortable and sometimes painful experience. Too identify and remove hindrances to our relationship with God means hard work. By nature, this experience conjures up negative emotions, which may lead to disappointment and depression.

During Lent I am always asked the question, "What have you given up for Lent?"Remember that Lent is meant to be an introspective time examining our hindrances to a full and complete relationship with God. My response is always followed by an explanation of "giving up." I can always "give up" caffeine, soft drinks, chocolate, sugar, dessert and many other items but what about those things that really keep me from God? Selfish thoughts, anger, impatience, rigidity and many others come to mind. I could give these up as I would the former but that simply would be creating empty space either in my stomach or in my heart. If I replaced them with God's presence then that would be removing a hindrance but allow my relationship with God to grow. Isn't that what Lent is all about? That is really "giving over" to God. By "giving over" to God and not simply "giving up," allows God the room in my heart to radically transform it. Each Lent I give up my most valued possession, my time. I attempt to increase my prayer, reading and devotional time. I turn over my time and allow God to fill it thus allowing God to radically transform my heart. On Easter Jesus radically transforms death by beating it and giving each of us eternal life and ever transforming our hearts.

JANUARY VESTRY REPORT

The Vestry met on Monday, January 23. After opening prayer by the Interim Rector, the Vestry approved the minutes of the December 19, 2016 meeting, recorded by the clerk, Deborah Rommel.

Deborah Rommel had emailed a report of the school board meeting from January 9, 2017. She reminded us of the Community luncheon fund raiser on Feb. 9, at noon in Tucker Hall.

Chrisie Jennings, Parish Administrator presented the 2016 financials. Income for the year was lower than predicted. Expenses were less than budgeted. The vestry voted to use investment income to fully fund the 2016 budget.

With current budgeted income, we face a deficit budget for 2017. There is additional investment income available, but the Vestry was reminded of the risk of relying on these funds to balance the budget each year. There was discussion of the need to increase income in order to balance the budget.

Barbara Cordova reported that there are no prospects for the Music Director/Organist position. She asked for continued prayers for an organist.

Earnest Roofing has inspected all the roofs for hail damage.

After the January meeting we received a report from Earnest Roofing, which was distributed to the Vestry by email. The damage was determined to be cosmetic. There are no roof leaks at this time. The Vestry voted by email that in order to avoid an increase in insurance premiums, we should live with the cosmetic damage, and not file an insurance claim at this time.

The latest version of the Parish Profile was approved.



Church Periodical Club Ingathering Sunday, March 26th



The Church Periodical Club (CPC) was founded in 1888 by Mary Ann Fargo and a small group of women in the parish of The Church of the Holy Communion in New York City. They began by sending bundles of church periodicals, prayer books, and Bibles via the Wells Fargo Stage Coach Line to clergy and laity, missionaries and Indians in the Dakotas, and the "far west". Much of the early growth of the Church Periodical Club was due to the fostering care of the Women's Auxiliary, now known as the Episcopal Church Women. This close relationship has continued through the years. By 1892, the Church Periodical Club was active in 48 dioceses providing many kinds of printed materials and a national office was established. In 1920, the National Church recognized the Church Periodical Club's great missionary work and it became a cooperating agency.

In the 1940's, the National Books Fund Committee was established to meet the rapidly growing book needs of the many overseas mission programs.

Since 1970, the CPC has been a self-supporting affiliated organization of the Episcopal Church with its office located in the Church Center in New York City. Delivery systems have changed but not the commitment. Supplying theological and educational texts, audio and video tapes and now computer software has enabled the CPC to continuously answer the needs of the worldwide Anglican Communion for over 100 years.

MARCH 8 - The Rev. Katherine (Kitty) Lehman



Kitty Lehman is a native of this diocese. Her father was ordained by Bishop Jones, from St. Mark's, San Antonio, after which he began St. David's mission in San Antonio, and then served on staff at Good Shepherd, Corpus Christi, before becoming Archdeacon of the Diocese of Southern Virginia. Kitty went to seminary at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific in Berkeley, before being ordained from St. Anselm's, Lafayette, in the Diocese of California. She served on staff at St. Stephen's, Orinda, and St. Stephen's, Belvedere, before being called as Rector of St.Bede's in Menlo Park, where she served twenty-two years before retirement. While there, during sabbatical study, she returned to CDSP to earn a DMin in evangelism and the arts. Since returning to settle in Kerrville and at St. Peter's, where her family has history, she

has served to supply Trinity, Junction and Calvary, Menard, congregations her father served later in life. She and her husband, Clay, a San Antonio native, have two daughters, who live with their families in California and Colorado.

March 15—The Rev. Tom Luck

Tom is a sixth generation German Texan, raised in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, and the son of a priest. An active church member from his days as a youth, Tom attended Austin College, majoring in British Studies and Philosophy, which included a semester of study n London. He attended seminary at Nashotah House. After spending two years serving a parish in Richardson, TX, he spent the next 30 years serving parishes in New Hapmshire, Maine, and New Your, most recently serving as Dean and Rector of St. Paul's Cathedral in Syracuse. A participant and Chaplain of the Clergy Leadership Project of Trinity Churh, Wall Stree, he has a Masters degree in Religious Studies from Harvard and a Certificate of Advanced Ministry Studies from Church Divintiy School of the Pacific. Tom is Program Manager of the FLOCK, the wine club of Hilmy Cellars, and an Assistant Clergy at St. Barnabas Church in Fredericksburg, where he lives with his wife, Jane. He and Jane enjoy music, food and wine, and time with their children and grandchildren.



March 22—The Rev. Tom Murray, III




Fr. Tom was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He attended Texas A & M University where he earned a B.S. in Psychology in 1987. He went on the University of Mary Hardin Baylor to obtain his M.A. in Psychology in 1989. In 1990, and for the next 3 years, Fr. Tom underwent brain tumor removal and resulting complications, necessitating hospitalization and recovery. After this life changing event, Fr. Tom attended the Virginia Theological Seminary and graduated in 1996.

Tom first served as a Chaplain Intern at St. Luke's Episcopal Hospital and Texas Heart Institute & Texas Children's Hospital in Houston, TX until 1998. He then worked as the Assistant Rector for St. Cuthbert Episcopal Church in Houston until 2000. Then, All Saints Episcopal School in Tyler, TX as the Chaplin until 2002. Tom then went on to serve as the Assistant Rector for St. Cuthbert Episcopal Church in Houston until 2000.

sociate Priest at Christ Episcopal Churh in Tyler, and the Assistant Rector at Trinity Episcopal Church in Marshall, TX. During 2004 & 2005, Tom served as the Rector at St. Michael and All Angeles Episcopal Church in Longview, TX. The Rev. Richard H. Elwood grew up in Waco at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Dick is a graduate of Baylor University with a degree in English and History, and from The University of the South (Sewanee) with a Master's degree in theology.

Dick served as the Rector of Christ Episcopal Church in Tyler during the 70's, and Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Kingwood from late 70's until mid 80's, and St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Beaumont until 2000. He became a member of the staff at St. Martin's in Houston, then retiring in 2005. Dick became the Interim Rector of St. Barnabas in Fredericksburg for almost five years, and most recently, on the staff of St. Francis Episcopal Church in Houston. Dick, and his wife Jane, have two grown children and three grandchildren.
