Dear St. Peter's Family,

I always welcome and appreciate the questions asked by the children in our parish and school. The other day, one little girl noticed the sacristy on her way out of school chapel, and she asked, "Fr. Bert, is that your kitchen?" I explained to her how it is not *my* kitchen, but it did give me reason to think about the preparation that takes place in the sacristy, much like a kitchen.

The plan for the reception for our ingathering Sunday fits perfectly with our stewardship theme: what we give, we gain. We are invited to contribute an ingredient (sugar, eggs, etc), and our ingredients will turn into something much more, a food to be enjoyed in fellowship on Sunday, November 12. What we give, we gain.

In one respect, what happens on Sunday mornings does begin in the sacristy. The altar guild works behind the scenes before our worship, and they work with the same attention to detail found in the finest of restaurants. The altar guild sets the table, and then we ought to expect more to happen once we commence with our worship. What we give, we gain.

In my *Episcopal Way* class, I teach on the dynamic nature of our worship; God is active and in motion throughout our worship. I am particularly struck by how much more comes out of our worship. We place a few ordinary elements on the altar that become more than they were to begin with.


The earliest Christians knew the process required to bring the bread and wine to the altar because they made the bread and wine! The grain required for the bread was the first gift, and the bread was the second gift. In the beginning of creation, we were asked to cultivate the earth, and in making bread, the earliest Christians and any of you bakers are obedient to do so. The same is true of the grape. It is the first gift, and it becomes more when it is turned into wine.

These gifts of bread and wine are then placed on the altar, and we ask God to do even more with these ordinary elements. *And*, by the grace of God, it happens. These gifts of bread and wine are sanctified to be for God's people the Body and Blood of Christ, the holy food and drink of new and unending life. So, it is even better than it was. What we give, we gain.

While the earliest Christians brought their homemade bread and wine to the table, we still bring the fruits of our labor to the altar when we ask God to do something with the money we place on his altar. What we give, we gain.

Quite simply, this is what our fall stewardship campaign is about. This is what our life is about when we give to the living God. In offering to God our bread, wine, money, souls, and bodies, we can expect more in life from the one who multiplied the loaves and raised the dead. With our God, the first gift is not the last. We have a God who delights in his own perpetual act of giving. When we turn to him, we ought to expect more. In him, what we give, we gain.



Before the final piece there will be a brief "tour" of the different sounds that this organ can make.


## LOST WOMEN OF THE BIBLE BOOK STUDY







## October Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on Monday, October 16 at 5:30pm. Fr. Bert opened the meeting in prayer, and at the beginning of the meeting, the Vestry approved the minutes from the September 18 meeting.

Chrisie Jennings, Parish Administrator, presented the financials that she worked on with Catherine Schulte, Treasurer. Previously emailed, Sept. financials showed overall income at 68% and expenses at 68%. Pledged and non-pledged giving is at 66%. Each expense category is below budget. The Vestry approved the financials.

Brooksie Bledsoe reported on behalf of the Newcomers Committee. A party for newcomers with appetizers will be held on Nov. 7, 6:00 pm at the home of Ellen and Paul Schoenfield. Twenty-seven (27) newcomers have been invited to the party.

Lou Ann Maxwell reported on behalf of the ECW. The minutes of the October 5 General Meeting and successful Style Show were presented. The financial balance is \$55,000 with yearly donations within the church and community to be given soon.

Deborah Rommel reported on behalf of St. Peter's School. Enrollment is at full capacity. A balanced budget for 2017-2018 has been approved. All are encouraged to attend this evening's Open House and Book Fair.

Lee Underwood, Junior Warden, reported to the Vestry. Lee is still waiting to hear from the roof company. The walkway between buildings still needs repair. The kitchen AC is 75% fixed, but a part has been ordered from the factory. Signage for Tucker Hall which would do double duty for Handicap parking on Sundays and church program school parking on weekdays was discussed. An example of the signage had been researched by Chrisie, and the example was circulated to the Vestry.

Barbara Cordova, Senior Warden, reported to the Vestry. Barbara presented the timeliness for the nominations committee for Vestry elections. The nominations committee was formed, including Jason Blewett, Art Bogie, Barbara Cordova, Fred Henneke, and Deborah Rommel.

Fr. Bert Baetz shared the Rector's report. Fr. Bert reported that he has reached an agreement with the Rev. Michael Wheeler to have Fr. Mike join the church staff as an Assistant Priest. At this point, Fr. Mike will mostly assist Fr. Bert with worship and the ministry of pastoral care.

Fr. Bert also reported on the plans for the Thanksgiving meal (Wednesday, Nov. 22) that will also include an inreach effort to take meals to homebound parishioners. The turkey and dressing for the meals will be provided by Francisco's.

Fr. Bert reported on the financial stewardship campaign for this fall with the theme *What we give, we gain*. Fr. Bert has been working with the theme in his teaching, preaching, and writing to the parish. The campaign will culminate with our Ingathering Sunday on Nov. 12.

Fr. Bert connected the theme with the work and purpose of a narrative budget. Fr. Bert, Chrisie, and Catherine presented a pie chart that breaks down the church's expenses into the categories of Worship, Christian Formation, Inreach, Outreach, and Communications. With these efforts, the rector, vestry, and staff are continuing to look at our finances through the narrative budget process.

The Vestry and Rector discussed the designation of the open plate on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday going toward the B.T. Wilson fund for a portion of their current needs.

The Vestry agreed to pay the school music teacher's salary for 2016-17 and for half of the 2017-18 salary. Funds from the Burney Fund will be used.

When the meeting adjourned, several of the Vestry members accompanied the Rector to the St. Peter's School Open House.

The next meeting will be Monday, November 20 at 5:30pm in the Multi-purpose Room of Tucker Hall. As always, anyone in the parish is welcome to attend. If you wish to be on the agenda and speak, however, please notify the Rector no later than the previous Wednesday, November 15, when he writes the Agenda and then emails the Agenda to the Vestry.

First serving a Baptist church as pastor six years in the Beaumont area (where he "blessedly" met Father DickElwood), Father Mike entered The Episcopal Church in 1987, serving two parishes in Houston—St. Martin's and St. Christopher's; then in the Diocese of Missouri until retirement two years ago.

Today, Father Mike and his wife, Robin, enjoy active membership at St. Peter's, and the beautiful Texas Hill Country life at their home in Hunt. Together, they have four children and three grandchildren.

Total income Year-to-Date: \$554,242  
Budgeted income Year-to-Date: \$611,230

Total expenses Year-to-Date: \$642,378  
Budgeted expenses Year-to-Date: \$706,085

Total (loss) Year-to-Date: \$ -88,136  
Budgeted (loss) Year-to-Date: \$ -94,855

In summary, our Vestry and parishioners approved a deficit budget this year. At this point in time (3rd quarter), we are under budget with our expenses, primarily due to expense management. Please make a mental note that the total income includes our customary budgeted transfers from endowments (Maintenance Fund, Burney Fund, Benevolence Fund).

## THANKSGIVING DINNER


